African American Community

The 2000 US Census states that African American people make up 12.8 percent of the country's total population. They are the largest racial minority group in the United States.

In Minnesota, African Americans make up 4.6 percent of the population (2000 US Census). The majority of African Americans in the state reside in its urban and suburban areas.

Disproportionate representation of African American children in Minnesota's child welfare system is an ongoing concern. Along with Native American children, they have the highest rates of contact with child protection. African American children were 4 times more likely to be reported as abused or neglected than White children were (MN Child Welfare Report 2008).
