
#### Minnesota's Immigration/Foreign Born Population Generally In Line With Its Size

- Minnesota ranks 21<sup>st</sup> in population size
- Ranks 19<sup>th</sup> in total population growth 2000-07
- Ranks 25<sup>th</sup> in percent population growth
- Ranks 20<sup>th</sup> in immigration (2004)
- Ranks 25<sup>th</sup> in foreign born as a percent of population (6.6%, US 12.5% in 2006)

#### **New Americans In Minnesota**


- Immigration—People who moved directly to Minnesota from other countries in the past year 13,814 admitted to legal permanent status in 2007
- Foreign Born--Born in another country who live in Minnesota 370,000 in 2006. Includes 27,000 born of American Parents
- Foreign Born Children of Foreign Born Parents— Born in another country who live in Minnesota 41,000 in 2006.
- US Born Children of Foreign Born Parents—US born children of foreign born parents 126,000 children under 18 in 2006.

### Major Classes Of Admission For New Legal Permanent Residents





### Legal Permanent Resident Arrivals To Minnesota Peaked In 2006




#### Minnesota's Foreign Born Population Has Been Increasing Since 1970

**Approximately 370,000 In 2006** 




### Minnesota's Foreign Born Population Concentrated In The 25-44 Age Range




#### Minnesota's Foreign Born Population More From Asia & Africa; Less From Americas




#### Minnesota's Foreign Born Children Generally Resemble The Total Foreign Born Origin
